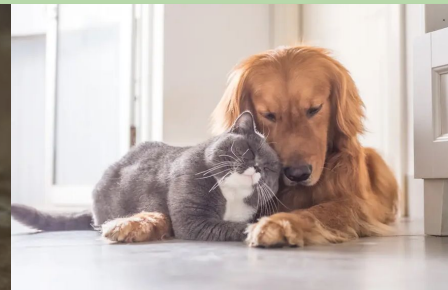
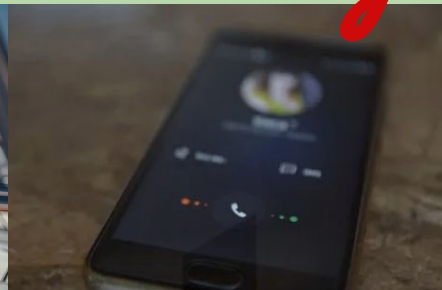

# Phrasal Verbs with Get 1



## **Get Across**

*To be understood.*

## **Get Ahead**

*To make progress.  
To become  
successful.*

## **Get Ahold of**

*To get in contact  
with someone.*

## **Get Along**

*To have a good  
relationship.*

"I hope I **got** my point **across** to everyone."

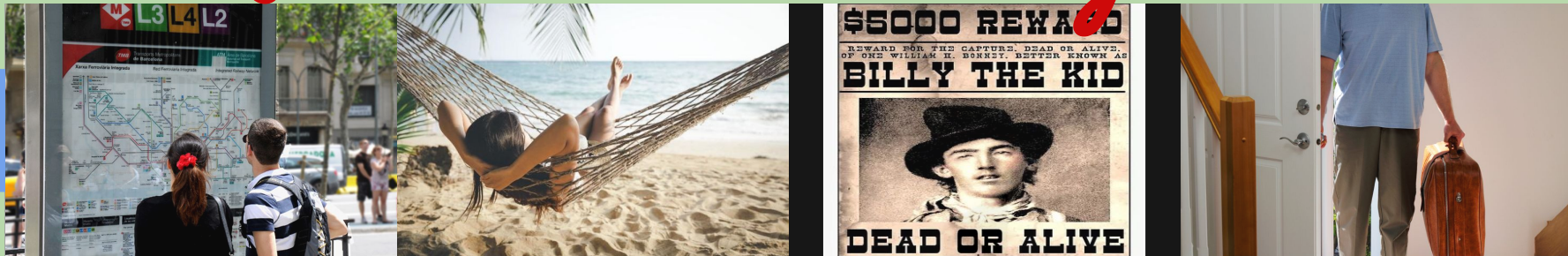
"It's a lot easier to **get ahead** if you speak English."

"I wasn't able to **get ahold of** you last night"

"My cat and dog **get along** very well."

# Phrasal Verbs with Get 2

Visual



Meaning

## **Get Around**

To move from place to place.

## **Get Away**

To escape.  
To tell someone to step back.

## **Get Away With**

To not be caught or punish for wrongdoing.

## **Get Back**

To return.  
To step back.  
To seek revenge.

Example

"It's not easy **getting around** a new city."

"Everyone needs a place to **get away** sometimes."

"I think it was easier to **get away with** crime in the past."

"I **got back** from vacation today."

# Phrasal Verbs with Get 3



## **Get Back Into**

To do something after not doing it for some time.

“After his divorce, he **got back into** skateboarding.”

## **Get Behind**

To fail to do as expected.

“I **got behind** on my credit card bill and now it's past due.”

## **Get By**

To survive with difficulty.

“Making minimum wage has me counting pennies just to **get by**.”

## **Get Down**

To achieve something.  
To get depressed.

“We finally **got it down** to 3 possible solutions.”

# Phrasal Verbs with Get 4



## **Get Drop off**

*To be left at a particular place.*

## **Get Into**

*To be accepted.  
To become interested.*

## **Get It Over With**

*To complete a tedious task.*

## **Get On**

*To start or continue something.*

"I **got drop off** at school by my dad today."

"I have **gotten into** the university of my dreams!!."

"I hate leg day but let's **get it over with**."

"I have to **get on** reviewing these legal documents."



# Phrasal Verbs with Get 5



## Get Off

To escape punishment.

"I **got off** with a warning last time I was speeding."

## Get Out Of

To avoid responsibility.

"My sister always pretends to do homework to **get out of** cleaning."

## Get Over

To recover from a bad situation.

"It took him a while to **get over** his ex-girlfriend."

## Get Pick Up

To be taken by someone.

"I'm **getting pick up** by my dad this afternoon."

# Phrasal Verbs with Get 6



## Get Through

To live a difficult experience.

## Get Together

To gather socially.

## Get Rid Of

To eliminate or discard.

## Get Stuck In

To be unable to move.

"It's difficult to **get through** the day without coffee."

"We **get together** every friday to play poker."

"I'm **getting rid of** some old clothes."

"The bear **got stuck in** the rabbit's hole"
