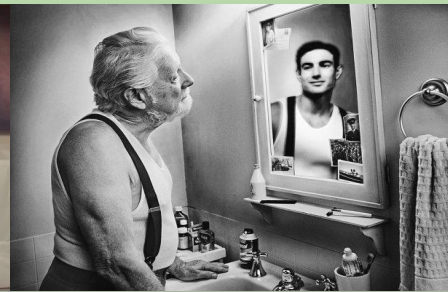


Phrasal Verbs with Look

Phrasal Verbs with Look 1



Look After

To take care of someone.

Look Ahead

To think about or plan for the future.

Look Around

To inspect a place.

Look Back

To think about or remember the past.

“After the accident, his best friend help to **look after** him.”

“We gotta **look ahead** and do better next year.”

“I **looked around** but didn’t see anybody.”

“**Looking back**, life wasn’t always good but it was perfect.”

Phrasal Verbs with Look 2



Look Down On

To have a low opinion of.

“She has always **looked down on** people from a lower social class.”

Look For

To search.

“My brother has **been looking for** a job with no luck.”

Look Forward To

To wait or anticipate something.

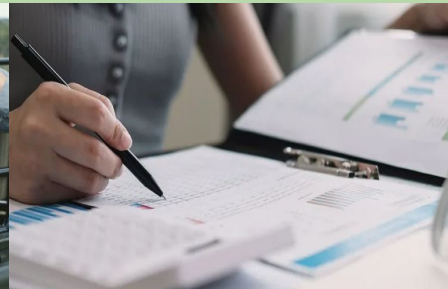
“The kids were really **looking forward to** meeting mickey.”

Look Into

To research or investigate.

“The police have **been looking into** the case with no leads.”

To watch without getting involve.

Look Out

To be careful.

Look Out For

*To keep alert.
To care for
someone.*

Look Over

To inspect.

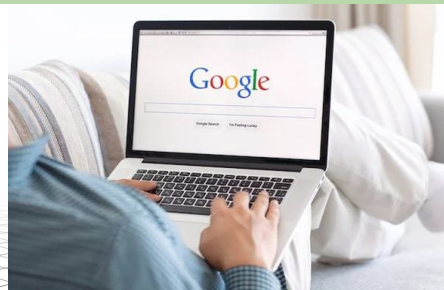
“Everyone just **looked on** as they yelled at each other.”
